

A Message from the City Manager Patrick Goff and the Emergency Manager Commander Salser

Yesterday afternoon the Governor extended our statewide Stay at Home Order through April 26, 2020. To align our City with that order, we will also extend the closure of City Hall through April 26. As a reminder, the Wheat Ridge Recreation Center, Anderson Building and Active Adult Center are closed through April 30.

Thank you for all you are doing to help contain the spread of the virus by remaining at home as much as possible and reducing your essential trips to the grocery store, pharmacy, and to work if your business remains open. Please also follow the recommendations to wear non-medical cloth masks when leaving the house to further reduce the risk of exposure to the virus, even when enjoying a walk on one of our Wheat Ridge trails or parks. Please remember dogs MUST be on a leash unless in our off leash dog park, and stay 6' apart if you do choose to be out with others not living with you in your home. If we all continue to do our part, we will continue to see a decrease in the numbers of people contracting the virus and needing to be hospitalized.

911 Emergencies only

Use 911 for crimes in progress or for emergencies. Do NOT call 911 to seek general medical advice or questions about being tested for COVID-19 or to report violations of the Stay at Home Order. Those with suspected COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath) should consider a telehealth visit or nurseline advice before seeking in-person care. Police Non-Emergency Number - 303-237-2220

Call the non-emergency number to file a police report for all non-life threatening events (e.g. theft, noise complaints, property damage, harassment) or incidents not occurring at that moment.

Animal Control

All emergent call should go to 303-237-2220 press 1 for Jeffcom Dispatch (e.g. injured or sick wildlife, animal safety welfare concerns, or dangerous/aggressive dogs). For other non-emergency concerns such

as barking dogs or lost/found pets, please leave a detailed voice messages for the Community Services Team at 303-235-2926. Call are monitored daily from 7 a.m.-5 p.m.
